WHY ARE WE DOING THIS?

After being involved in the community for many years both as active community members and philanthropically, Taryn and Andrew Boyarsky felt a deep connection to the people they were meeting who were impacted by disability. They slowly learned of the services they were not receiving, of the inclusion not always taking place, of the social, educational, vocational limitations they felt due to their disability, and so, they took it upon themselves to see this change.

It was clear to them that the best way forward was to fund projects directed by the people who needed them, and so, The Choice Foundation was formed, to do exactly what it claims to do, give people Choice.

OUR PROGRAMS

A Weekend Away

Funding: JewishCare

Idea: Initiated by an Individual



A Weekend Away provides a unique opportunity for people with a disability to go on a holiday with friends of all abilities. Led by volunteers of similar ages and interests, 3-4 people with disabilities go away with 3-4 people without disabilities for a fun weekend . Starting on a Friday night to create a Shabbat together until Sunday. The homes they stay in are holiday homes generously donated for the weekend by members of our community.

Annual Cost \$10,000

Anticipated future cost

\$20,000 p/annum to expand the offering to higher needs participants, an opportunity to travel outside of NSW, and to offer more frequent weekends.

Flex Funds

Funding: JewishCare

34 Individuals received funding in 1 year

Flex Funds is a new avenue of funding for families in financial stress as a result of their child's or their own disability. Available through JewishCare, this new source of funding can relieve families of the cost of assessments, services or other needs, based on a discussion with a case manager.

Learning Support Officer

Funding: Kesser Torah College

22 Children receiving learning Support

A unique grant provided for Funding to employ a full time learning support officer in the high school at KTC for the first time.

With reports that KTC has a large cohort of students with additional learning needs and no support, this funding has been essential in assisting students to make gains in their learning with 1:1 support.

Annual Cost \$50,000

Match Funded by another donor Totalling \$100,00

J-JOBS is a new innovative customized employment program run by and through JewishCare that works with individuals with a disability who are interested in securing customised employment. J-JOBS works directly with employers to help them identify and develop the appropriate work and skill sets for the client. They then support the client and the employer for the duration of the initial phase of the placement.

Annual Cost \$110,000

Improved Accessibility and Inclusion at Sydney Jewish Museum

Funding: Sydney Jewish Museum

The Choice Foundation Funding solved an ongoing intention to take a formal look into the museum and its accessibility. While looking at other museums around the world and how Sydney Jewish museum (SJM) can offer best practice. SJM is now committed to creating an inclusive and accessible environment in all areas of service. They believe inclusion includes both physical accessibility and enhanced inclusion practices beyond the physical space, considering visual, learning and other needs. They also acknowledge this is an ongoing process.

Annual Cost

\$15,000

All Abilities Dance Program

Funding: JewishCare

142 Students have participated in the Program

A weekly dance class for all abilities taught by top dance teachers and run through the Maccabi all abilities team

The Maccabi Dance Project employs professional paid teachers to engage participants in a dance studio environment. There are a few different avenues of how the dance program provides access and submerges its services to the community.

Educate Through Experience

Funding: Maccabi All Abilities

520 students participated

An Opportunity for young students in Jewish Day schools to learn first hand from a person with a disability about finding success and joy, no matter their ability. Students can now hear from and experience playing wheelchair Basketball with a paralympian at school as arranged by Maccabi.

\$7,000

8 Events run in the last 12 months 40 Participants

Upskill provides those with a disability the opportunity to learn specialised skills with likeminded people of all abilities. This includes skills such as coffee and cocktail making, floristry, hospitality and much much more.

Designed as a social outing but with the intention behind the scenes being to support participants in the day to day rituals of purchasing tickets, engaging staff, and taking public transport. All to upskill in life skills.

A guaranteed fun night out learning new skills as decided on by the participants, with the intention to guide these learned skills into paid employment opportunities or future hobbies.

Camp Sababa Extension Programs

Funding: JewishCare Run by: Individuals

250 Particpants

Camp Sababa facilitates a range of programs, including an annual overnight holiday camp, for young people with disabilities aged 7-24 years old. They encourage social inclusion for all abilities and provide support to parents and families who provide year-round disability care for their children.

Camp Sababa Extension Programs are run through JewishCare providing extra programs to support the annual camp, and the funding has been broken into 2 parts:

- Sababa Reunion A reconnection for ex campers who have outgrown camp Sababa, but have not outgrown eachother. Offering events and social activities to reunite.
- 2. Sababa Sibs Siblings of children with a disability tend to grow up with a deep and complex understanding of the disability sector. This is an opportunity for them to not worry about anything else but fun and meet like minded friends

The funding provided allows for these programs to run throughout the year as the leaders/volunteers of each program design the events.



Surfs UP is where community members with a disability can learn how to surf and hang out with like minded people, all under the supervision of trained Lets Go Surfing Instructors.

A Jewish group home will be set up with this funding to house up to 4 people with a disability and a support worker.

WHAT'S NEXT FOR TCF?...

2022 has proved to be yet another successful year for JCA The Choice Foundation.

Notwithstanding its challenges and the continued impact Covid has had on our community and the opportunities to run larger social events.

Our response to Covid, as was most people's response, was to re-evaluate some of our funding opportunities and to find new ways of engaging people.

This included developing a program called Flex Funds, which allows for families who need financial aid to support their child through the early years of assessment and evaluation. Acknowledging the financial stress Covid placed on many families, particularly those with children with disabilities.

As 2023 rolls in, The Choice Foundation will remain firm in its mission to continue to advocate, support and grow an inclusive and accessible community for all members. Our focus now moving forward is to grow in this space.

We have recently aligned ourselves with the new Hakoah at White City, guaranteeing \$500,000 .The funds for Hakoah have been clearly stipulated to employ an inclusive architect to review the physical and social needs of our choice foundation community.

The funds will also support an inclusion officer onsite whose responsibility it will be to ensure that the needs of people with varying abilities are met in the programming of the overall experience onsite.

We would like to take this opportunity to acknowledge the community we have built over the last 4.5 years whilst developing JCA The Choice Foundation. The families who have entrusted us with developing programs and services and spaces that serve their loved ones. The same people who have sat with us for hours upon hours to help us understand their needs, their frustrations and their hopes.

The volunteers who have delivered time and time again by creating and delivering programs and offering their friendship and time is absolutely what sets us apart from other communities. We could not do this without our volunteers.

As we approach 2023, and we take stock of the 11 programs we have so far invested in, we can only hope that the year to come delivers programs that are as meaningful and as impactful.

Applications for new investments into JCA constituent organisations opens at the end of 2022 for financial support and advocacy support. We have made a commitment to each program that we invest in, to stand alongside them and nurture their ideas and help the program to flourish.

We look forward to seeing how we can continue to maximise the supports, access and inclusive behaviours of this wonderful community.
